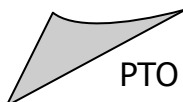

Please note: *The medical profession takes the view that a parent's consent to medical treatment cannot be delegated.* This view is explicit in the Children Act 1989. Thus medical consent forms have no legal status and a doctor/nurse insisting on the consent of a parent to particular treatment has the right to do so. For this reason, the Camp Leaders do not insist on you signing the statement above. At the same time, it can be a comfort to medical staff to have a general consent in advance from parents or to have a Leader on hand able to sign forms required by the medical authorities.

Do NOT bring mobile phones, or any other electronic 'devices' including electric toothbrushes. They're too easily lost / broken or stolen, and they're a distraction from the camp experience. The Camp Leaders will have mobile phones, which your child is welcome to use to contact you if necessary.

Behaviour Policy

We expect a good standard of behaviour from your child at all times in Scouting, but this is especially important during camp. We understand though that no one can be perfect all the time, and that 'testing' the rules is a natural part of a young person's development.

If your child does misbehave, the leaders will use their discretion in doing one of the following -

1. Talking to your child about their behaviour, reminding them of the rules.
2. Issuing your child with a 'yellow card', warning them that if their behaviour doesn't improve, they will be sent home.
3. Issuing your child with a 'red card', which will mean being sent home immediately.

Normally, the three steps would be taken in order if behaviour didn't improve. Depending upon the severity of the behaviour however, we may issue a yellow or even a red card without warning - this would only be done under extreme circumstances though. We will talk to you at the end of the camp if your child has been issued a yellow card, or if there have been any other issues.

That said, we try to focus on recognising and rewarding good behaviour, rather than merely punishing bad behaviour.

Other Information

1. Please give your cub their tea before drop off as we shall not be having a full evening meal on Friday. Please drop your cub off at Ullesthorpe campsite at _____ on Friday 28th June and pick them up at 2pm on Sunday 30th June 2019.
2. Your cub may bring up to £5 pocket money to spend at the campsite shop. Please provide this in change, in a labelled wallet which will need to be handed into a leader upon arrival.

5. Please note the reminders on the kit list and don't let your cub bring anything electrical to camp. It will either get lost, broken or wet and this tends to cause many tears! If they do bring anything, I shall leave it in my car until the end of camp, but all the car parks are open, so I cannot guarantee its safety.

SPARE CLOTHES – Not best clothes please, accidents will happen. Please wrap in polythene bags to keep them dry and label the bags so that your child knows what is in each one.

- An extra set of clothes are needed for a water activity and an extra plastic bag for putting them in!

MEDICINES – Any medicines must be clearly labelled with your child's name and dosage and should not be packed with your child's kit, but handed to a leader at drop off.

DATA PROTECTION
