St. Georges Dragon



Introduction

Create a clay model following the streamed / video demonstration and these instructions. Once dry you may decide to paint it too. Share a picture of your model with your leaders which will contribute towards the craft activity badge and creative challenge award.



Before you Start

Make sure you have a clear work area, preferably with a smooth surface which can be easily cleaned. If necessary cover the floor to prevent any bits which are dropped from damaging the floor covering. Do not eat or ingest the clay.

Be careful when using any tools.

You will Need

200 grams of air-drying clay (supplied) Pencil Blunt knife Teaspoon Optional for painting once dry; paints and brushes

Instructions to make your Dragon



Divide the clay into 8 pieces




1. An egg-shaped body

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


- 2. 1 tail
- 3. 1 head





- 4. 2 legs
- 5. 2 arms + 2 ears



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6. 2 wings + 6/7 spines



- 7. Shield and lance
- 8. Spare for any bits that go wrong!

Put the dragon together;



- TIP when putting your dragon together, lightly scratch the pieces you are joining and add a drop of water to act as glue
- Allow to dry in a safe place for 2 or 3 days without disturbing it.
- Clear up the work area and tools used tidy up.
- Thoroughly wash your hands!

Optionally

Paint your model to your own design.
